In order to correctly logon to the new Blue Cube 6.2 Back Office, you have to add the website to your Trusted Site list in Internet Explorer. The BlueCube back office website needs to have specific security settings configure in Internet Explorer to allow for a successful login. The configuration of the security settings does not impact the overall security of Internet Explorer, and only changes the security settings pertaining to the BlueCube back office website.

Read through the attached document and perform the steps outlined in the document if you have not already done so. We would also ask that you make the guide available for any employees who may access the back office from home as they to will need to configure the security settings for Internet Explorer.

## Adding Blue Cube 6.2 Back Office to Internet Explorer Trusted Sites

The process for adding the address to your Trusted Site list will be very similar on Internet Explorer Version 7.0



3. From the **Internet Options** window select the *Security Tab*. Make sure that *Trusted Sites* is selected, and select the *Sites* button. (Figure 2)







4. From the **Trusted Sites** screen enter the following address in the **Add this website to** the zone: (Figure 3)



sites to the Trusted Zone


